

Tuesday

Titus 3:3: "For we ourselves were also once foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving various lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating one another."

"Who do you think you are?" That's a question that many children have been asked by their parents when the children are misbehaving. Christians should ask each other a similar question: "Who do you think you were?"

If we are a Christian it is a fact that God has changed our hearts; a fact that we sometimes underestimate. Sometimes though, we tend to see the changes in our lives and forget that it was God that made the changes. We didn't change ourselves. God came and changed us. He made us new. We forget that fact and we look down at other people who have not been changed by God. Because of the sin that remains in our members, we continue to think that we are better than others even after God has changed us. Someone needs to ask us, "Just who do you think you were, anyways?"

Jesus gives the answer in this passage. You were no better than our government leaders or your parents. You were no better than the false teachers who blaspheme God. You were and still are no better than any other person on this Earth. It is only God's grace that has produced good and righteous fruit in you. So why do you look down on others?

You were "once foolish": You did not know God. In fact the Bible tells us that you were unable to know God until the Holy Spirit opened your eyes.

You were "disobedient": You rebelled against all authority, even good authorities. It did not matter if it was your parents, teachers, or God himself, you were rebellious, fighting to have your own way.

You were "serving various lusts and pleasures": This is profound. You served your evil desires because you loved them. You loved evil and you willingly and happily gave your best efforts to it. You thought everything was great, but there was another side to this that you could not see.

You were "deceived": You thought that you were choosing to serve your evil desires and that you could pack up and leave whenever you wanted. The truth was that your evil desires had wrapped you in chains and made you a

Thursday

Let's look some more at Titus 3:4-6.

Let's focus on the work of the Holy Spirit. Remember that God the Holy Spirit is a person who does great and wonderful things just like the Father and the Son. Two of the actions that the Holy Spirit performs are the acts of *regeneration* and *renewing*.

Remember from yesterday that the Holy Spirit washes us. But how exactly does He do that? First, he regenerates us. We talked about that yesterday as well. The English word *regeneration* comes from the Greek word *palingenesia*. *Palin* means "again" and *genesia* (like the book of Genesis, the beginning of the Bible) means "birth." So, the first step in our washing is to be born again. Remember, Jesus told Nicodemus that we must be born again in John 3. We were dead, but the Holy Spirit makes us alive. He makes this happen in a moment. One moment you are dead. The next moment you are alive.

The next step that the Holy Spirit takes, after regenerating us and making us alive, is to renew us. He makes us alive in a moment, but renewing us takes a lifetime. To be renewed means to be made holy. It means to be made like Jesus. Often this renewing is called *sanctification*. As time goes on, the Holy Spirit continues to work in us. We grow. We become more like Jesus.

Keep in mind that the Holy Spirit regenerates us without our help, but when he is renewing us, we must cooperate. We need to decide to open our Bible and read it. We need to decide to pray. We need to decide to go to church. We need to decide to obey the Bible. If we do not do these things, the Holy Spirit will not renew us. Thankfully, He works in Christians and causes them to open their Bible and to pray, etc. Do you do those things? If you do, then you have some reasons to believe that you are spiritually alive. If you don't, you may still be dead. That leads to our last point for today.

Verse 6 says that the Holy Spirit has been poured on us abundantly. This means that God poured the Spirit on us like an ocean. On one hand, we can be thankful that God has given to us so generously, and we know that we will grow because we are soaking in the Holy Spirit. But what if we are not growing? If a tree is well-watered, but its branches are rotting and falling off, what does that say about the tree? It is dead. What does it say, when the Holy Spirit is all around us, but we are unchanged? Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved.

slave. If you would have tried to leave your evil master, you would have discovered that he would not allow you to and that he had been tricking you all along.

You were "living in malice and envy": When you saw people blessed, you envied and hated them. You thought that you deserved the blessing that they had instead of realizing that no one deserves to be blessed. You should have rejoiced that God gave blessing to someone else, but instead you plotted how to harm them. There are many examples of this in the Bible. Cain envied Abel. Jacob's sons envied Joseph. Saul envied David. The older brother envied the Prodigal Son.

You were "hateful and hating one another": I don't think that requires much explanation. You were a person that was full of hate and unrest. You saw the problems in your life and in the world and you hated other people because you thought they were to blame.

So, if you are a Christian, remember who you **were.** Thank the Lord that you are not that now, but never forget. Be humble before God and kind toward others.

Lord, when I stop and consider what I was before you saved me, I am humbled. As I, even now, see some of the same tendencies in my life I ask you to forgive me and grant me repentance. Lord, please wash me and make me more and more like You. Holy Spirit strengthen me to do the Father's will. Amen

Wednesday

Today's reading is Titus 3:4-6.

Yesterday, we saw who we were without God, "but God, who is rich in mercy," (Ephesians 2:4) changed us. God's kindness and love appeared and we were saved. We were made new. We were born again. But why? Matthew Henry refers to God as the divine *philanthropist*. A philanthropist is someone, usually a rich person, who generously gives to other men. He helps the poor, he gives gifts, he works to improve the lives of others. He has the means and ability to help people who cannot help themselves and that might not even deserve help. Well, God is the ultimate philanthropist. We were helpless. We could not save ourselves nor did we deserve to be saved, but God poured out love (philos) on man (anthropos).

What motivated God to save us? Was it our loveliness? No, that was not his motivation, because we were not lovely. Was it our good works? No, that was not his motivation because we had none that were acceptable to Him. God was motivated by his very character. It is in God's character to be "merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth." (Exodus 34:6) God takes joy in showing mercy and love to man. He loves to show pity and mercy because He is good. He is gracious to us, so we should be gracious to others.

So how did God save us and change us? As we already saw, God the Father's kindness appeared to us and he poured out God the Holy Spirit, through Jesus, God the Son. The Holy Spirit, in turn, washed us, regenerated us, and renewed us. He washed us from our sins. He made us over again. He made us a new creature (2 Cor. 5:17) and gave us a new heart. (Eze. 36:26).

In short, God for His own reasons and by His own power, without any help from us, completely changes us. If we are a Christian, we have completely new thoughts. We love new things. We want new things. Boys and girls, take this seriously. If you are a Christian, sin will continue to assault and plague you, but you are free and you are new. If you do not have new thoughts, new loves, and new wants, then you don't have any reason to be confident that you are a Christian. Look to Jesus and live. Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you shall be saved.
