The Lord's Day and Monday

This week's text is **Titus 3:12-15**.

When I send Artemas to you, or Tychicus, be diligent to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there. Send Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their journey with haste, that they may lack nothing. And let our people also learn to maintain good works, to meet urgent needs, that they may not be unfruitful. All who are with me greet you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

Well, this week we wrap up Paul's letter to Titus. In this passage, Paul is almost done teaching, so he gives some practical instructions to Titus.

First, we see that Paul wants Titus to meet him in a city called Nicopolis. But if Titus leaves, who will take care of the church? Paul is going to send one of two men, Artemas or Tychicus, to take over for Titus.

Second, we notice that two other men, Zenas and Apollos, will be traveling through Crete. Paul instructs to Titus to make sure that the church gives them food, a place to sleep, etc. It is quite possible that Zenas and Apollos were the men that delivered Paul's letter to Titus.



Finally, Paul gives one final piece of teaching and "signs" the letter. He instructs the church once again to "maintain good works" and he gives greetings and blessing to all of the true believers in Crete.

All who are with me greet you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.


Let's summarize what we have learned so far. The Christian life can not be one without action. We can not just sit in church and do nothing. We must make an effort to advance God's kingdom here on earth. We do this with good works. God calls some people to be missionaries to foreign countries, while he calls others to stay at home. Does that mean that the people at home have nothing to do? No, not at all. We here at home must witness to our family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers. We must also support those people that God has called to be missionaries, pastors, and evangelists in their efforts. We should love to meet needs of fellow believers.

Now, Paul says farewell. Paul and his companions send greetings to Titus and they ask him to greet the others in Crete that love them "in the faith." We see here a unity that all believers have. Time and distance cannot separate believers because we are all in Jesus. We are all apart of the body. If you love Paul in the faith, if you acknowledge him as your brother, then Paul's greeting is for you.

Finally, Paul prays that grace will be with the believers. They needed grace and so do we. The Christian life is impossible without the grace of God. Praise the Lord that he gives us his grace in the same way and in the same measure that he gave it to Paul and his companions. Let's avail ourselves of it in prayer and live it out in fruitful lives.

"I always say this. Missions...there are only two ministries in missions. You either go down in the well or you hold the rope for those who are going down. Either way there will be scars on your hands. Stand up. Show me your scars. What has it cost you to be a Christian? What has it cost you to follow Him? Today we will study **Titus 3:12**


When I send Artemas to you, or Tychicus, be diligent to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there.

We can't be sure, but many scholars who study the Bible think that Paul was in Philippi when he wrote his letter to Titus. He was planning, however, to spend the winter in a city called Nicopolis, and he wanted Titus to meet him there. Nicopolis was probably a city that Caesar Augustus founded to celebrate his victory over Marc Antony and Cleopatra. It also likely that it was a place for Paul and Titus to meet each other half way. It may have been a nice place to spend a winter, but more importantly, it was a city from which other areas like Dalmatia could be reached with the gospel.

Dalmatia

Before Titus leaves for Nicopolis, Paul wants him to wait for other men to come and take his place. Paul realizes the need that the church has for good leadership and he knows that the church in Crete is not strong enough yet to be left without a leader.

Paul sends Artemas and Tychicus and we can infer, or make a very good guess, that Paul knew them well and trusted them. It almost

<u>Thursday</u>

The reading for today is **Titus 3:14.**

Remember that yesterday, Paul had told Titus to take care of Zenas and Apollos when they came. Today we see that Titus was not the only one who was responsible to complete this task. The other church members in Crete were also to help out.

Paul wants the people in Crete to learn and keep learning how to do good works. One of the best ways to learn how to do good works is by practicing. In other words, you learn to do good works by doing good works. You learn on the job. We must read God's Word and then do what it says. He will teach us and help us to do a better job as we obey. If we do not obey, we will not learn.

An example of a man who practiced doing good works was Epaphroditus. If you read about him in Philippians 2:25-30, you will see that he was a man who helped and served others so diligently that he became deathly ill. He literally was spending his life (using it up) to serve God's people. Others in the church of Philippi were helpful to Paul and ministered to him as well as to God's people. (Philippians 4:15-16)

Why must we practice good works? The last part of the verse tells us that God does not want us to be unfruitful. We are saved by grace. Grace is the root of our tree where we draw strength and food from, but the fruit of our tree should be wonderful fruit that glorifies God. The Lord wants us to flourish and bring forth much fruit to be enjoyed by those around us.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." - Ephesians 2:8-10 1. What is Paul wanting Titus to do according to todays verse?

Wednesday

Today's reading is Titus 3:13

Here again, we meet some more "obscure characters" of the Bible. Even though they only have small mentions, I hope you are understanding what great work the Lord did through men like Artemas and Tychicus. They were men who gave their lives for their Lord and I pray that we can be like them for Jesus' sake.

So today we meet Zenas and Apollos. These guys were probably the "mailmen." In other words, it probably was the case that they were the ones carrying around and delivering letters to the churches.

Zenas, as you can see, was a lawyer. He may have been a lawyer like the ones we have today or he may have been someone who studied God's laws very carefully. In other words, he may have been a theologian of sorts.

Apollos is a more well-known figure. I must say that Apollos was a man that we should look up to as a hero. With all due respect, all of the macho NFL players have no concept of the awe-inspiring, biblical manhood that Apollos displayed. He was "mighty in the Scriptures," "instructed in the way of the Lord," "fervent in spirit," speaking and teaching "diligently the things of the Lord," speaking boldly, helping much, mightily convincing people, willing to learn and be corrected. (Acts 18:24-28) Wow! Praise God! Surely, he is a man we should look up to.

Be careful though. Do not worship Apollos, but worship the Lord who worked in that man's heart. In Corinth, some of the church members were idolizing Apollos. They claimed to be Apollos' disciples. Paul rebuked (corrected) them and told them to follow Jesus and to be Jesus' disciples. Apollos' example was wonderful, and the Lord had made him godly, but his example should point us to the perfect man, the God-Man, Jesus Christ our Lord. "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." (1 Cor. 11:1)

Finally, we notice that Titus is instructed to meet the needs of Zenas and Apollos. The church should be willing and able to help these men who were serving them. Zenas and Apollos were sacrificing many things to serve the Lord and his church, so Paul asks that the church sacrifices to help them.
